

Ken-ichi Takashima was born in 1939 in Tokyo, Japan. He is Professor Emeritus, the University of British Columbia (UBC), Vancouver, B.C., Canada. In 1958 he entered Sophia University (Jōchi Daigaku) in Tokyo where he studied classical Chinese, English, and general phonetics. In his third year he transferred to the University of Washington in Seattle, Washington where he obtained a B.A., M.A., and Ph.D. in the fields of Chinese language and linguistics. In 1971 he was appointed as Assistant Professor in the Department of Oriental Studies, University of Arizona, Tucson and in 1973 became Assistant Professor in the Department of Asian Studies, UBC, Vancouver, Canada. In 1985 he became a research fellow at the Institute of Oriental Culture (IOC), Tokyo University. In 1988 he was appointed as Associate Professor and in 1989 he was promoted to Professor at IOC, Tokyo University. In the same year he was also promoted to Professor (in absentia) at UBC. His research interests are related to pre-Qin Chinese and Chinese palaeography with a concentration on oracle-bone and bronze inscriptions. So far he has published eight books and some eighty scholarly articles in Europe and America, Japan, Hong Kong, Taiwan, and Mainland China.
