ABSTRACT As a first step, the annotation procedure in CRC 1475 requires the identification of potentially metaphorical words associated with metaphors. Using a standardised approach such as the *Metaphor Identification Procedure VU Amsterdam* (MIPVU) may lead to more consistent annotations than relying on intuition alone. However, MIPVU was originally developed for contemporary English texts and has only been applied to a limited number of other languages, which excludes many of the CRC's source languages as well as historical text genres. This workshop will firstly explain MIPVU as a method and its steps, and secondly discuss issues to be considered when applying MIPVU to texts within the CRC.
